This is the ILTEA A2 English Test. Listening. There are five parts to the test.	
Part 1	<p>Look at the instructions for Part One. You will hear five short conversations. You will hear each conversation twice. There is one question for each conversation. For questions 1 to 5, choose one answer for each question. Here is an example:</p> <p>How many people were at the meeting? Were there many people at the meeting?</p> <p>Woman About twenty. Man That's not many. Woman No, but more than last time. Man</p> <p>The answer is 20, so there is a mark on answer C. Now we are ready to start. Look at question one.</p>
Question 1	One. How will John get to work?
Woman Man Woman Man	<p>Are you driving to work tomorrow, John? No, the car is broken down again. Will you take the bus then? No, the bus is too slow. I'll take a taxi.</p> <p>Now listen again.</p>
Question 2	Two. Where are the earrings?
